- It's not part of the Roma culture (heterogeneity of the communities)
- Consequences of a long history of antigypsyism in Europe
- It's a political will.

- End Dictatorship / beginning democracy
- Boom of associations movement followed by
- a Roma movement
- Aims changed over the years

- Roma State Council advisory body
- Department of Roma Issues Governement of

Catalonia

- Barcelona Roma Municipal Council







CHALLENGES

- It's not an own model
- Dependency on public funding/limitations
- Political powerless
- New generations







POLITICAL COMMITMENT

- Political will is needed
- Roma people into political life is needed
- After nearly 40 years 3 Roma in the Spanish Parliament

- Heterogeneity of the Roma people and communities
- Different social and political context
